

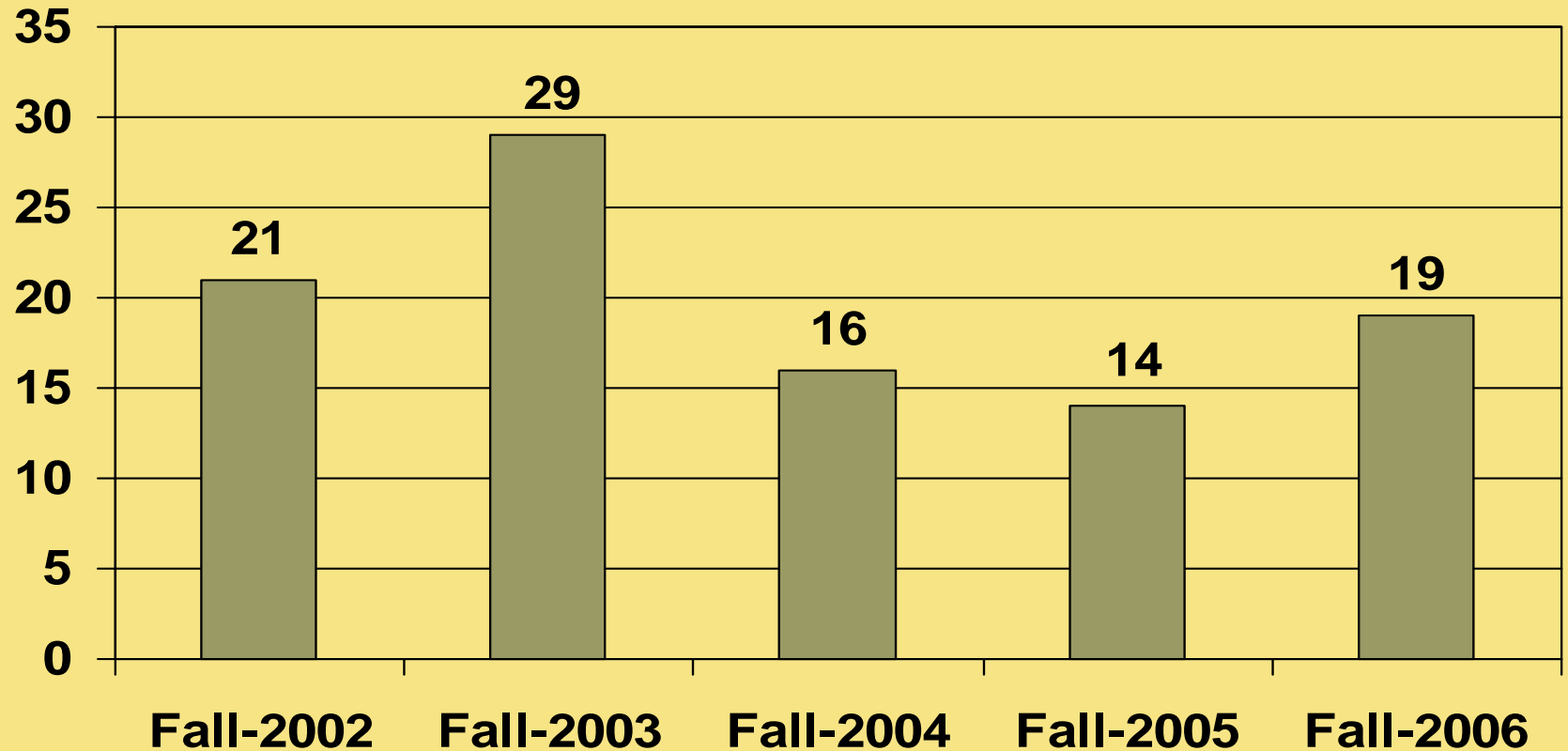

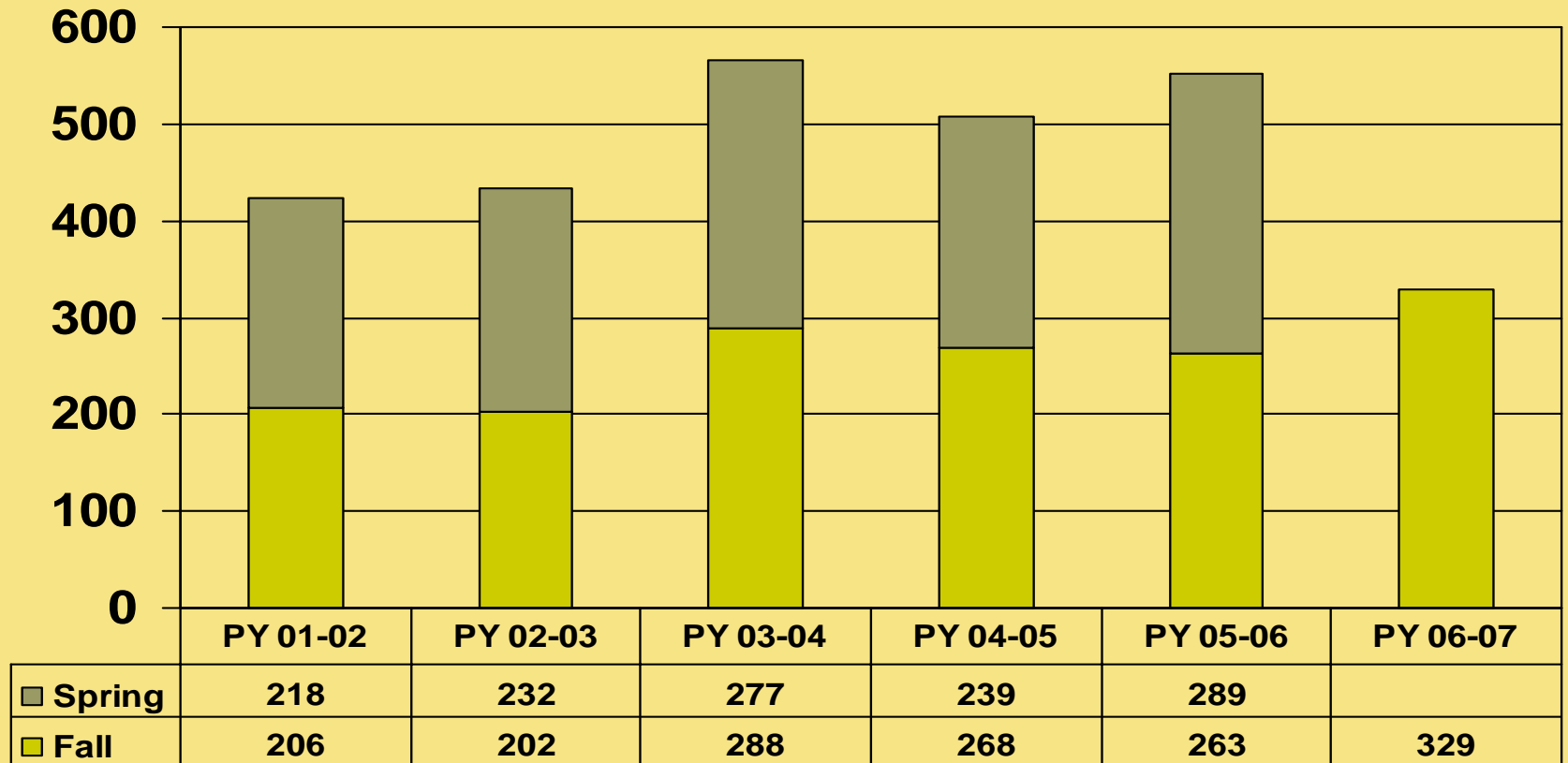
Five Year Enrollment Trend

Declared Majors



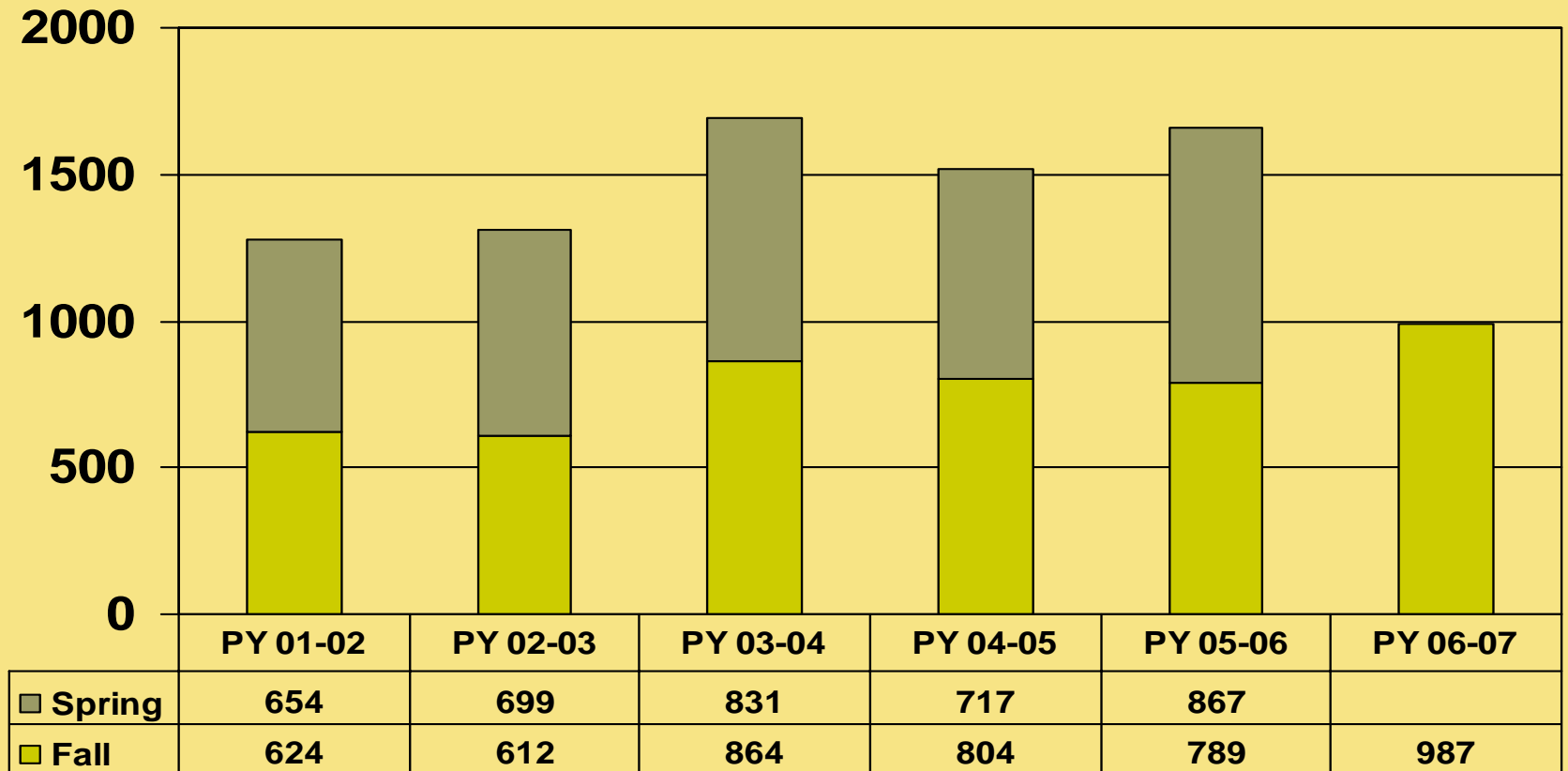
Five Year Enrollment Trend

Course Enrollment



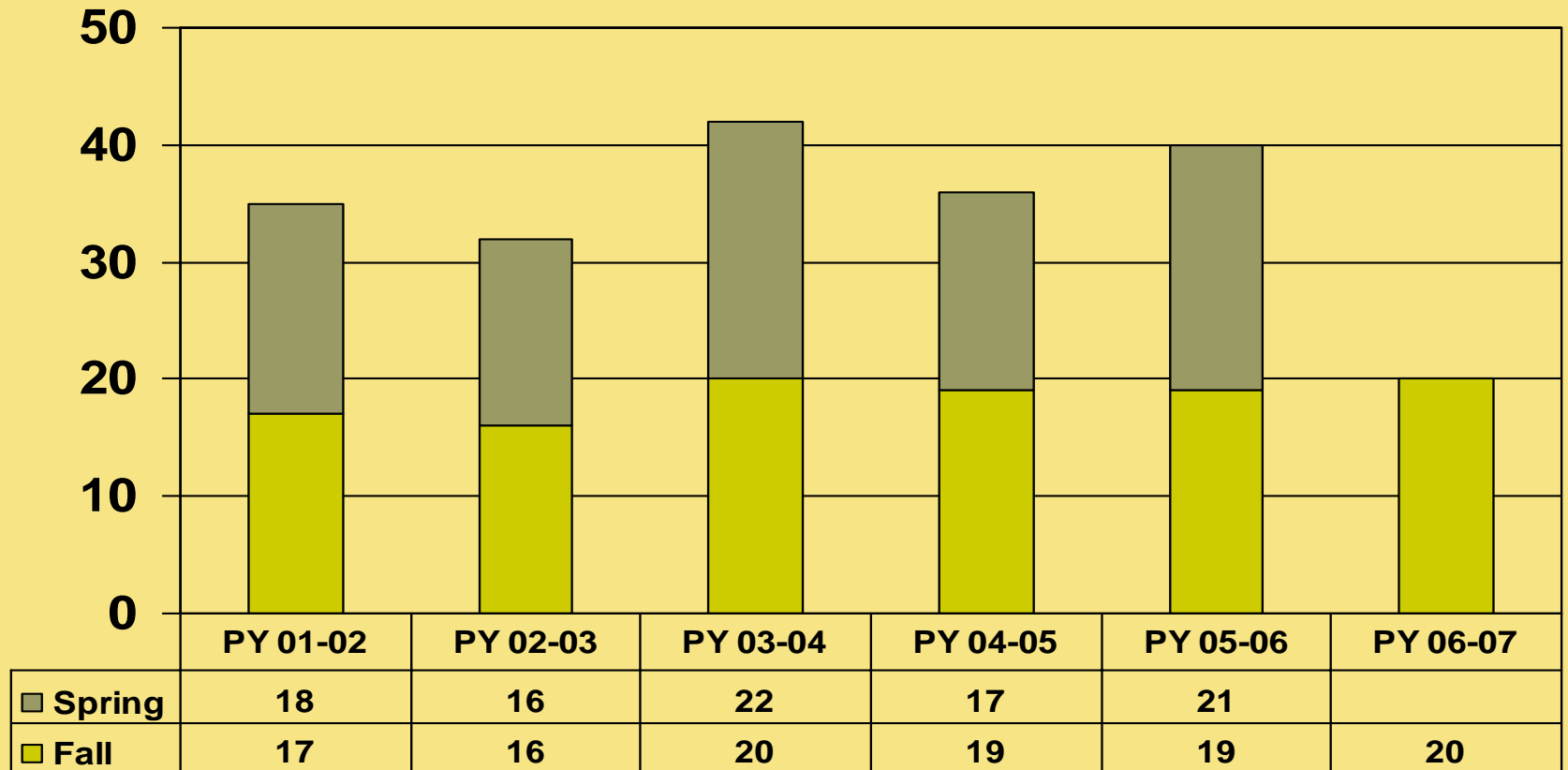
Five Year Enrollment Trend

Semester Credit Hours

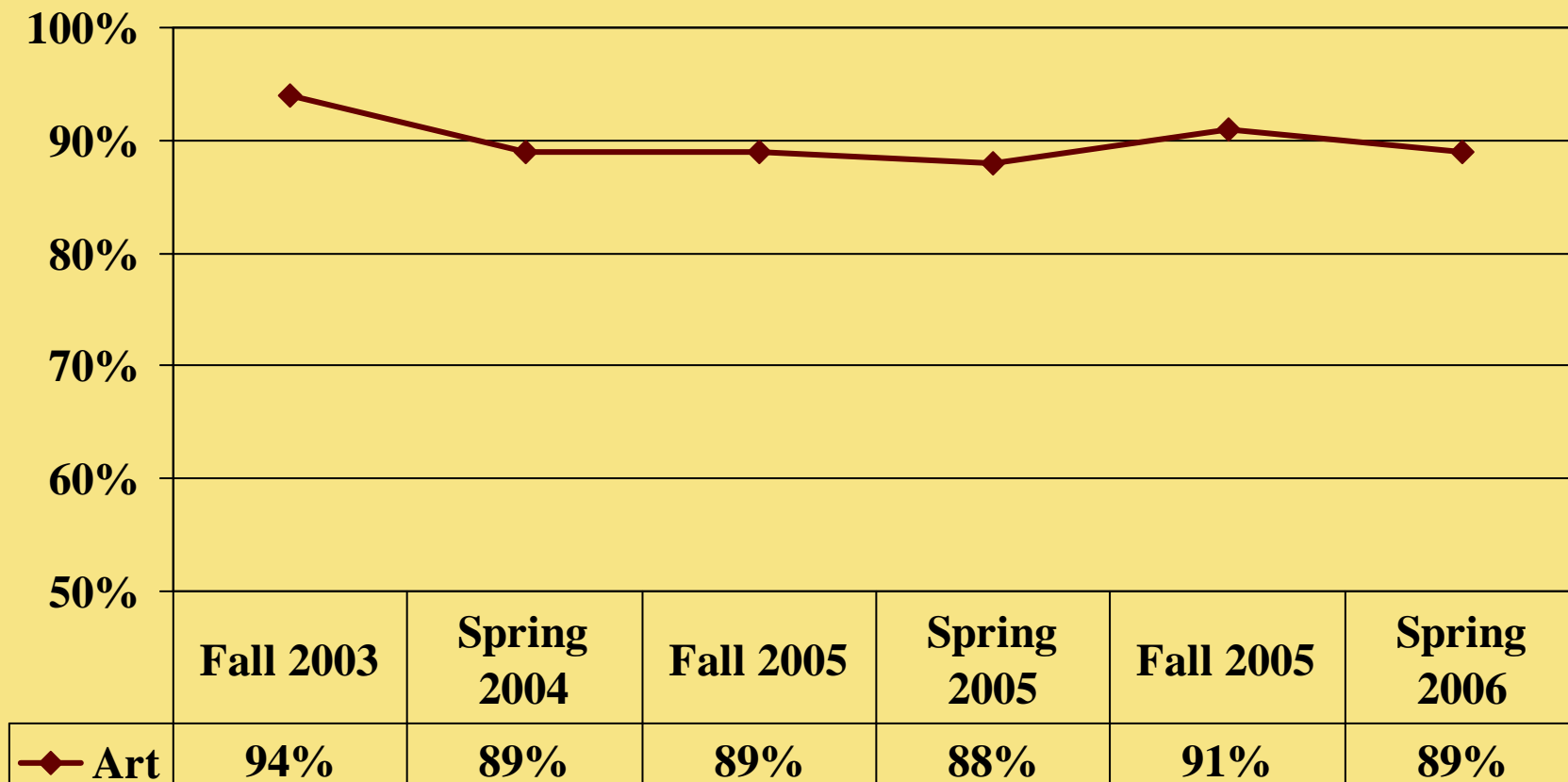


Five Year Enrollment Trend

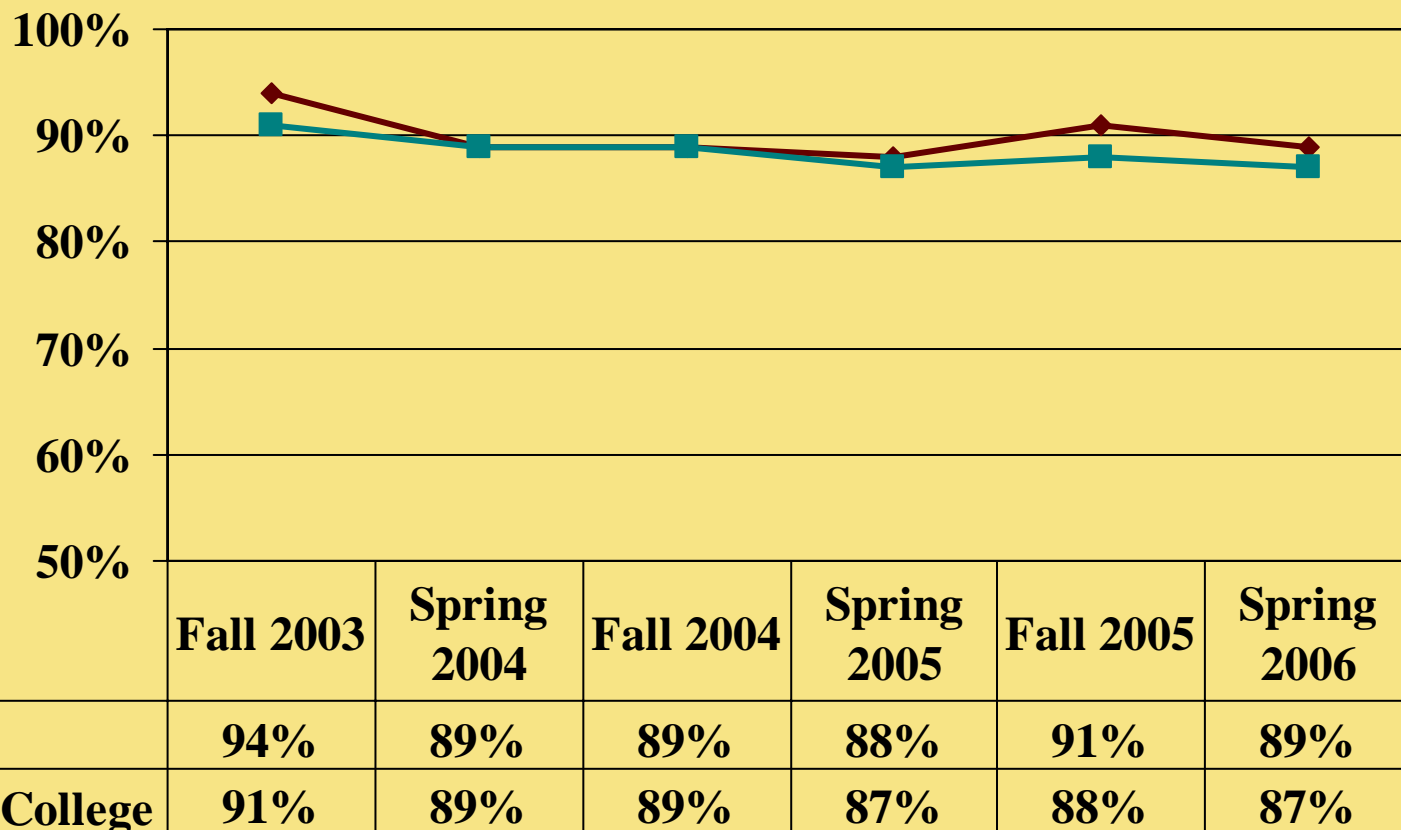
Classes Taught



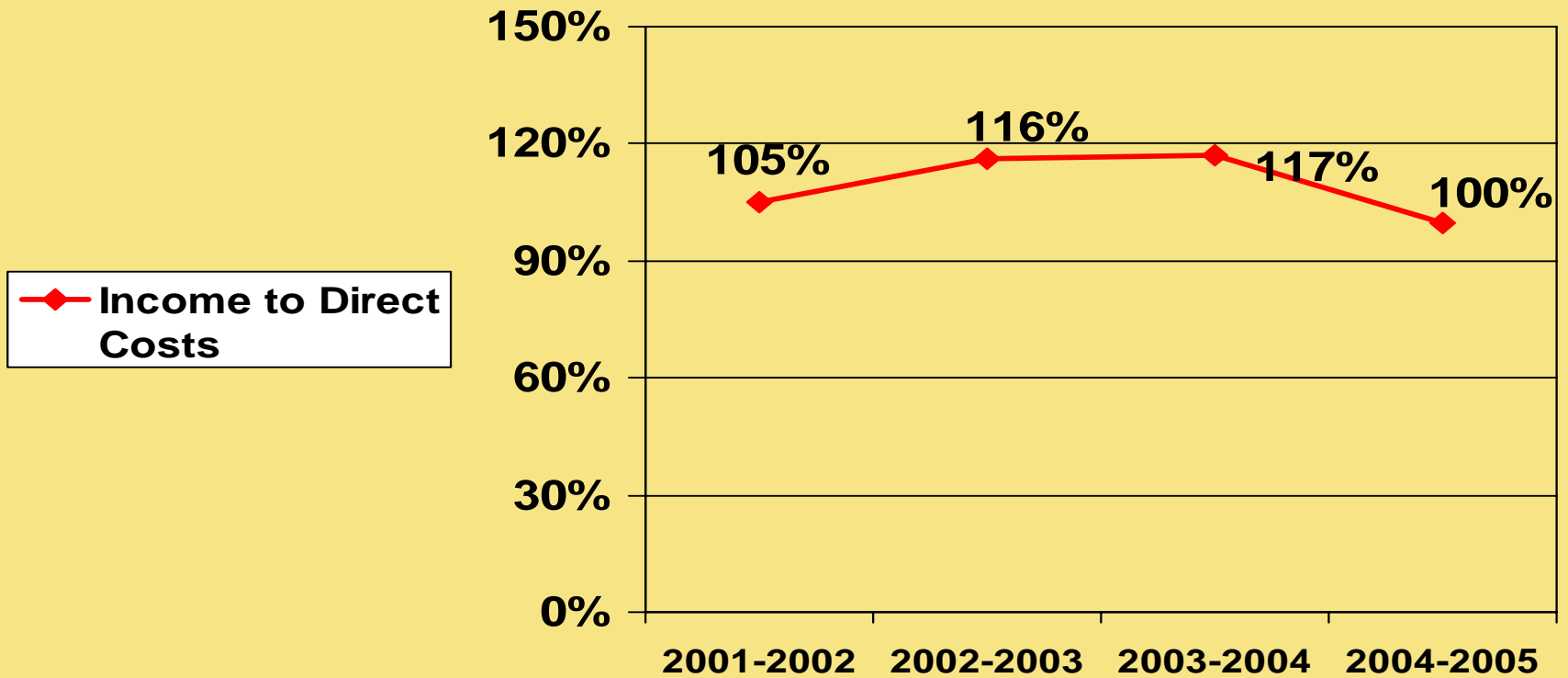

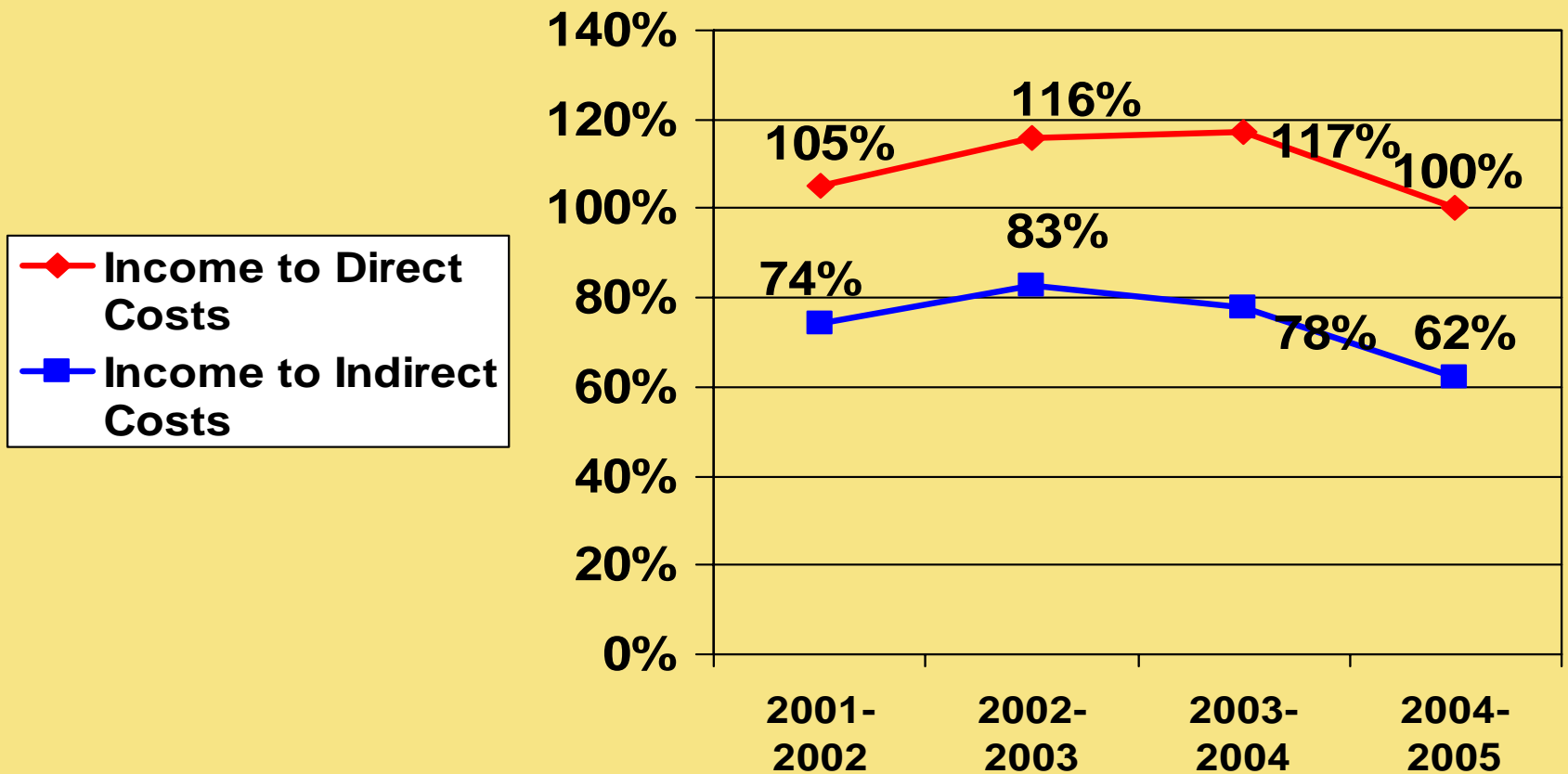

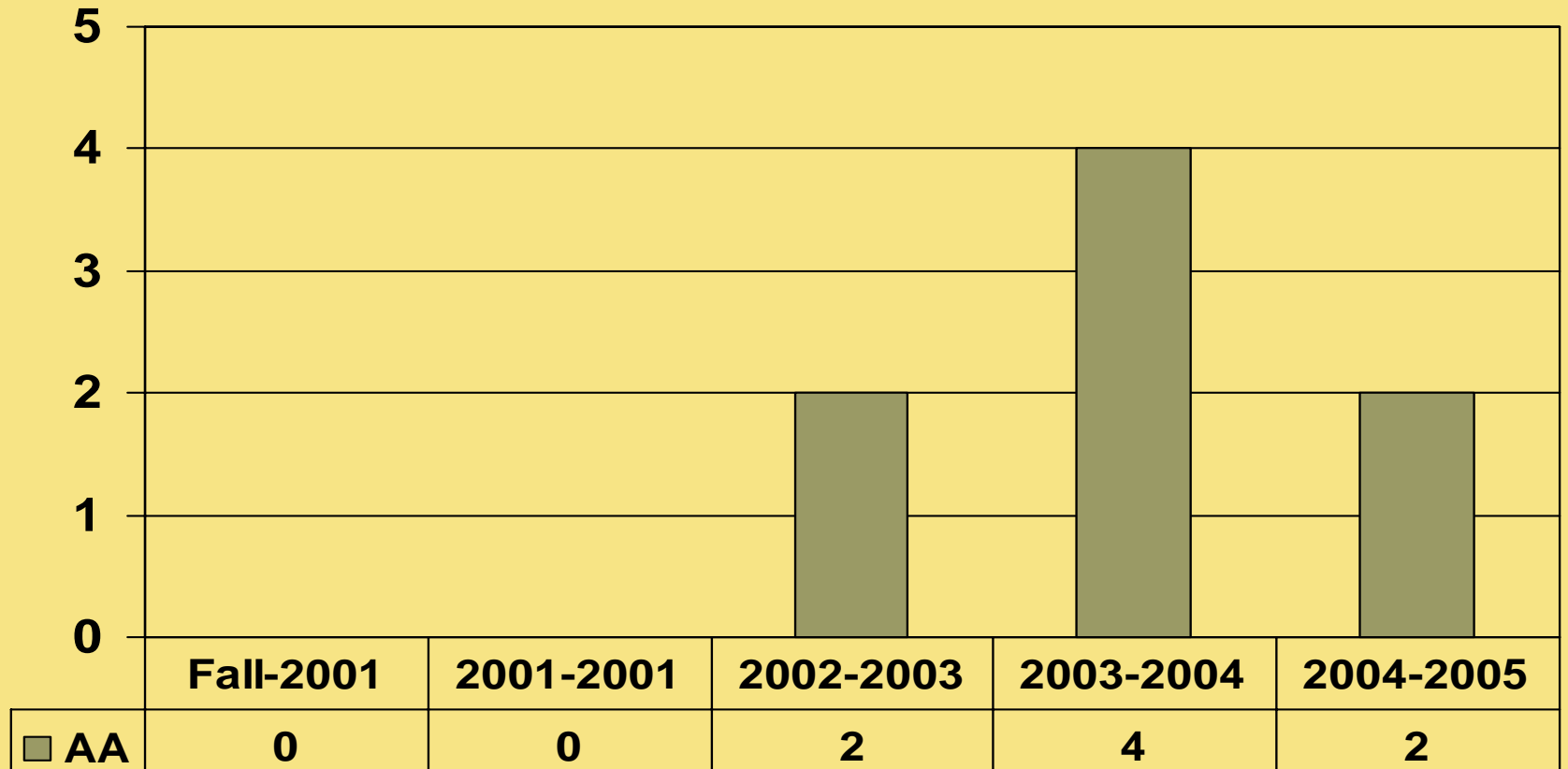

Successful Outcomes for Graduates

- ❑ Successful outcomes are described as finding employment within 1 year of graduation or continuing in higher education
 - 100% for 2004 graduates-first follow up done

Department Characteristics

- ❑ 2.93 full-time faculty
- ❑ 4 adjunct faculty
- ❑ Courses: The Temple College Art Department offers courses that satisfy degree requirements for the Associate of Arts Degree or that transfer to four-year institutions of higher learning. Many students also enroll in art to satisfy fine arts degree requirements. Other students take art for enjoyment and personal enrichment.



Department Characteristics

- ❑ Located in the Visual Arts Complex building just north of the main Temple College Campus
- ❑ Classes are also taught at the Cameron Education Center and Temple College at Taylor
- ❑ The department also offers internet and a telecourse

Visual Arts Complex

- ❑ Facilities: The visual arts classes are located in the new visual arts complex located at 2101 S. 5th Street, only four hundred yards from the main campus. This 17,000 square foot facility houses a new art gallery, computer lab, photography lab, audio/visual lecture room, drawing/printmaking studio, ceramic/sculpture studio, painting studio, and outdoor kiln/foundry work area. Studio space and hours are flexible, which enable the student to work in the facility outside of class.



Visual Arts Complex

- ❑ One challenge with the current facility is to accommodate 15 students in each class. Options are being studied such as taking over the building behind the VAC which could be used for additional office space, an enlarged darkroom, a studio room for taking photos, and storage. There is also the possibility of offering jewelry making as a new program in this space.



Visual Arts Complex

- ❑ There is additional room in the computer room for 3 additional computers to bump up enrollment to 15 in those classes and funding is being sought.
- ❑ Printmaking, which is offered occasionally, is limited to 12 students because of use of the printing press, hot plate needs, vent-a-hood usage, and other related equipment and space needs.
- ❑ The other classrooms fulfill the needs and numbers of students and the instructors are pleased that the redesign of the space has worked so well.

Affiliation

- Temple College is a member of the Texas Association of Schools of Art, which is an organization that supports the visual arts in community college and universities. It makes recommendations to the coordinating board and makes recommendations on core courses, transferability, and professional standards. Michael Donahue, Department Chair, is also a member and has served on their board in the past.



Community Outreach

- ❑ Art exhibitions and workshops provide educational opportunities to the students and the community. The department has presented exhibitions of tremendous quality and value unparalleled in the community. (one show was valued at close to one million dollars)

Community Outreach

- 27th Annual Central Texas Art Competition and Exhibition. (*November 18 - December 4, 2006*)
 - Encourages and challenges the student artists in the Central Texas area
 - It also provides the community an opportunity for the appreciation of the creative efforts of these artists.
 - Serves as a marketing and recruitment effort for the department and the college



Community Outreach

- ❑ Ongoing storyboard creation and art displays with Scott and White
 - Created by art scholarship students and department head
 - Excellent recruitment and public relations
- ❑ Recruitment in schools through the “Artist in Schools” program on Fridays, both locally and statewide

Student Opportunities

- ❑ The art department offers a limited number of scholarships
- ❑ The department offers summer drawing classes in Ireland—11th year (*May 15 – 29, 2007*)
- ❑ Student art work is displayed in the VAC as well as on the Department website
- ❑ Scholarship students participate in the Scott and White ongoing art displays
