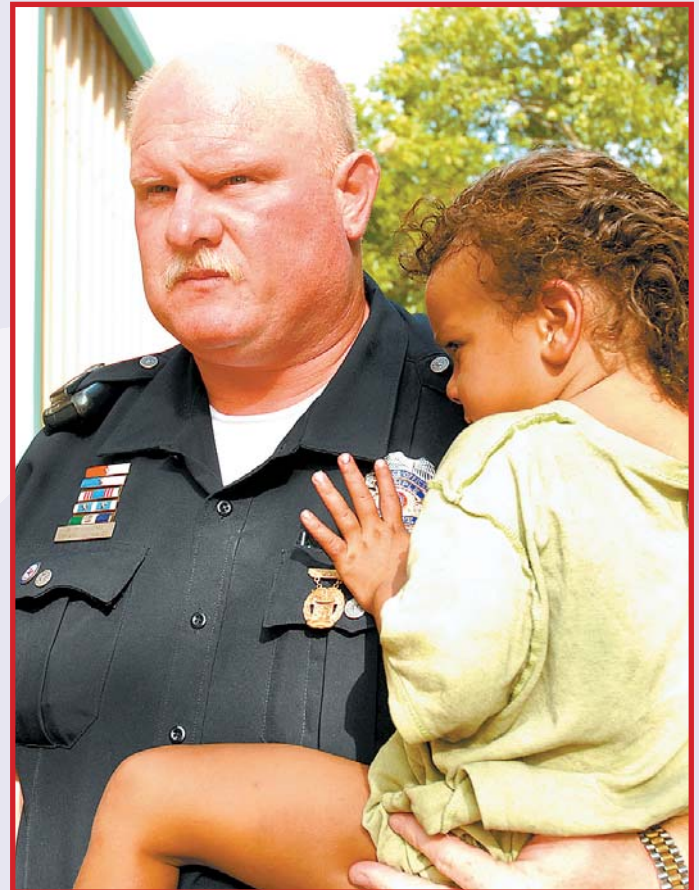

Belton High School and Temple High School Offers a series of Tech-Prep criminal justice courses for students interested in Criminal Justice. Tech-Prep courses taken during the Junior or Senior year can be transferred over to Temple College for technical academic credit. This academic credit applies to the Associate of Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice. Students are encouraged to become involved in the Skills-USA programs at Belton High School and Temple High School to develop leadership skills and participate in competitions which can lead to the area or state level.

Temple College Criminal Justice offers three degrees: Associate of Arts in Criminal Justice, Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice, and a Criminal Justice Certificate. This program has articulation agreements with numerous four year institutions; additionally, this program holds an annual Criminal Justice Career Fair and Criminal Justice Field Day. Students are afforded numerous intern opportunities with local criminal justice agencies. This program includes two full-time instructors and a training coordinator. Classes and degrees can be completed either online or on campus during the day, or at night.

Temple Police Department conducts their Police Academy at Temple College and the Temple College Criminal Justice Training Coordinator works specifically with Temple Police Department to support the academy. Temple Police Department Training Sgt. and the Temple College Criminal Justice Training Coordinator work together to provide training opportunities to Central Texas area law enforcement agencies. Additionally, Temple Police Department provides intern opportunities to Temple College Criminal Justice students.



The events of September 11, 2001 changed the American view and understanding of Criminal Justice. An important component of maintaining the structure of a civilized society, Criminal Justice offers a wide variety of career opportunities in law enforcement, corrections or security administration, and related public and private occupations. Students may begin a career in Criminal Justice while in high school with many options for additional educational opportunities ranging from certificates to the two-year associate degree, a four-year baccalaureate degree and beyond.
