

# Dental Hygiene

D. Ring

Meet at Periodicals section. Show Dental Hygiene periodicals. How organized. Articles found through computer databases, either will be full text, or will be abstracts with citations, find full text articles in periodicals section.

Go to RK section, main spot for DH books, RK is subject letters for Dentistry.

Go to computer lab.

Handouts: Brochure, Dental Hygiene Journal List

Log in to computers, TC Home page, point out WEB MAIL (check web mail for library notices) and link to Library.

1. **Brochure** Hours, ILL, Texshare

2. DH Journal list Titles in CAPS, bound means we have journal in paper format followed by our holdings by date range; all titles will be Indexed in MEDLINE or CINAHL, many will have full text in one or both databases.

Some will have a note line for Website, which means that full text is available from an online source.

3. Databases:

Links to databases are listed on this page.

Scroll to bottom of page until you see ONLINE JOURNAL ACCESS.

Click on the link to the Online Journals page. When doing this off campus, you will have to enter your user name and password after clicking.

You would go to this section for full text journal article access from home, or on campus. You can tell which journals have online access by looking at the Journals handout. This is a way to go to a journal for full text. There are other ways to get full text from other journals by looking in databases like Academic Search Complete, CINAHL and MEDLINE.

Click on the link to **Journal of Dental Hygiene**.

To get the most recent issues online, you have to go to the online journal page.

The issues available are linked from this page. You could click on an issue and browse through it, or you can search for topics in the Journal.

To search for topics, do NOT use the quick search; it will bring up articles other than in JDH that we can't access. Instead, click on advanced search.

In the Search For box, type in **Oral Health**

In the Publication box, type in **Journal of Dental Hygiene**

To the right of **Show** be sure to click on Subscribed Titles (other titles that we don't subscribe to that have the words in *Journal of Dental Hygiene* will display, even if we don't subscribe to them).

To the right of **Sort Results by** click on newest first (this is optional, you can leave as it is if date of publication doesn't matter).

Choose one and click on the link to the article.

Toward the bottom of the screen you see buttons that allow you to open the article in either PDF or HTML format. Click on HTML to open the article (or pdf if you don't have an html link).

Click on the home icon in the browser to get back to TC homepage.

Library — databases -- health sciences.

The last search allowed you to go to an online source for full text. Not all of the journals have online full text. You can still search other journals that we subscribe to and see if there are articles that you could use. If you want to find out what other articles might be available, you can use another database to check for citations, and then come to the library and pull the journal from the shelf and find the article. To search for articles in *Journal of Practical Hygiene*, we will use the database called CINAHL with Full Text.

Click on CINAHL

To search citations in one or more selected journals:

- a. click on Publications
- b. In the Browsing CINAHL with FT Publications box, type in the name of a journal. For this example use **Journal of Practical Hygiene**.
- c. Click on Browse button
- d. *Journal of Practical Hygiene* displays at the top of the list.
- e. Click on the empty box to the left of the journal title.

To add other journals not on the same page do this:

- a. Highlight the current journal name in the search box.
- b. Type in the name of another journal, in this example use **Journal of Evidence Based Dental Practice**.
- c. Click on the empty box to the left of the journal title.
- d. Click the Add button.
- e. Click on the Search button.

On the next page you see the first search box has the title codes for the two journals you selected to search.

Two empty search boxes are available to enter terms.

In the first search box, type in the term "plaque"

To the right of the search box is a menu, click on it and select TI Title. This will cause the database to search in article titles for the term typed in the box.

Click on the Search button.

Each of the articles has the word plaque in the article title. Some are full text, but all are ones that the college subscribes to—if not full text in the database, then print out the citation to the article you want, and look in the DH periodicals section for the journal.

To find **citation help** click on an article title.

On the next page look at the far right column, find and click on “Cite”

A new box will open.

The APA style is near the top.

Note that the URL is not included. If your teacher requires the URL you can get it by clicking on the Permalink, three links down from the cite link. A small balloon opens, you have to highlight dragging your cursor to the right to select it all, and then copy the URL into the proper place in your citation.

Click on the link to TEMPLE COLLEGE at the top of the page. Click on **MEDLINE**.

To find articles in all the Dental journals that TC subscribes to, do the following. Remember, many of these will only be citation searches, and you will have to go to the periodicals section in the library to find the journals and then make copies of the articles.

- a. look below the second green horizontal line in the Limit your results section.
- b. click on the box to the right of Temple College Dental Journals
- c. Do not select any other limiters.
- d. Go to the top of the page and click in the first empty search box.
- e. type in Gingivitis
- f. to the right of that box you see “default fields” listed.
- g. click on the arrow and a menu will display. Scroll down and click on SU Subjects when you see it. [you could select TI Title at this point instead, but I wanted to use something different]
- h. in the empty search box below where you typed “gingivitis” click and type the word “hygiene”
- i. click on search button.

201 articles display.

If you find an article that you want to look at, you can click on the title link, read the abstract, then either go to the library shelf and find the journal or go to our online journals section and check to see if the journal has full text access. You may notice a few do have a link to full text either within Medline or through ScienceDirect.

Click on the link to Temple College at the top of the page.

Last type of search we will do will be to try to find full text within a database, without concern over which journal the article comes from.

Click on **CINAHL**

In the search box, type in **oral health**

In the second box type in **disease**

In the Limit your results section, click on the box to the right of Full Text.

Find the published date from section, enter 2005 in the top box and 2011 in the bottom box.

Click on the Search button.

All of the resulting articles should be full text. Choose one by clicking on the PDF full text link.

To find the citation, do the same as in Medline.

Click on the Home button in the browser. Click on Library, then Electronic Book Resources

and the link to **Stat Ref!**

STAT!Ref is a database of medical dictionaries and other medical reference books. If you need to look up technical information on oral diseases and conditions, or drug information, this is a good database to use.

In the search box, type **gingivitis**  
Search

Links are to sections of the medical reference books.

Click back on the browser until you see the link to the catalog on the library home page, click on it.

#### 4. Catalog

When looking for books in the online catalog, usually you would search by subject heading, title, or keyword.

But since there are a relatively small number of books dealing with dental hygiene and dentistry topics, I'll show you a quick way to see them all so you can browse the titles in a list.

To find books directly related to Dental Hygiene do the following search:

- a. Click on the menu to the right of the search box.
- b. Select Call Number Browse.
- b. click in the box and type in RK
- c. click on search.
- d. all the call numbers that begin with RK will display. These will be books about or directly related to dental hygiene. You can browse through several pages, and see other books in the RK subject area that might be useful.
- e. when you find one you want, write down the full call number, and go to the shelves and find the book.

click on the Search tab at the top of the page.

Keywords Anywhere Search:

- a. Type in Dental Hygiene in the search box
- b. Search.

Some books will have a table of contents, a summary and other information. The ones with a picture of the book to the right of the title will have additional information.

Click on the title link for the first book.

Scroll to the bottom of the page and notice the Browse this Shelf section. You can click the arrows to the right and to the left of the book found in this search to see other books on the shelf nearby. You can click on the image of a different book to go to that book record.

Back to this one though:

Click on the image at the left side

There is a table of contents and summary for this book.

If you decide after looking at the information given that you would like to get this book, write down the call number and then go to the RK section and find it.

If you need any help finding books, or periodicals, or anything else I have discussed, ask for help at the circulation desk.
