

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

PROPOSED TAX RATE: \$0.038320 per \$100

NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE: \$0.035561 per \$100

VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE: \$0.038469 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2023 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for East Williamson County Higher Education Center from the same properties in both the 2022 tax year and the 2023 tax year.

The voter-approval tax rate is the highest tax rate that East Williamson County Higher Education Center may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that East Williamson County Higher Education Center is proposing to increase property taxes for the 2023 tax year.

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON 09/15/2023 05:30 PM (CT) at Central Office, 200 College Street, Hutto, TX

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, East Williamson County Higher Education Center is not required to hold an election at which voters may accept or reject the proposed tax rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the governing body of East Williamson County Higher Education Center at their offices or by attending the public hearing mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE TAX RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by East Williamson County Higher Education Center last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by East Williamson County Higher Education Center this year.
