PROGRAM DESCRIPTION/SALARY

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Professions Department offers coursework to prepare students to practice as an EMT, Advanced EMT, or Paramedic and offers a two-year Associate of Applied Science Degree in Emergency Medical Services. Graduates are eligible for state and national certification exams required for employment. The primary role of EMS professionals is to provide patient care in pre-hospital settings and during transfer of patients between health care facilities. They respond to requests for out-of-hospital health care, assess patients, initiate treatment under written or verbal orders from physicians, and transport patients to appropriate facilities. Admission to the EMS program requires a separate application in addition to admission to Temple College. Application requirements for each program are listed in the college catalog. The number of students in the program is limited by spaces available for clinical experience in affiliated hospitals and EMS provider organizations. Student are accepted for advanced course work beginning in the Fall semester at the Hutto Center and the Spring semester at the Temple campus.
